Time to buy a new tractor?

I've been looking at replacement tractors and I think it is time to upgrade to a better model. The one I would recommend is a John Deere model G100, available from Home Depot. It is a garden tractor, which means it has larger wheels and is heavier duty than a lawn tractor. It has a 25HP Kohler, vertical shaft, V-twin, overhead valve engine, and a 54" mower deck, and a hydro-static transmission. The price is \$3899.00 plus tax. The tractor shed door will have to be modified to fit the larger deck which should not be a big problem.

Our current tractor has a 12.5 HP Kohler, vertical shaft, single cylinder, overhead valve engine and a 42" mower deck. It was purchased in March, 1992 for \$2100.00 plus tax. It is still in good condition and can be sold to offset some of the costs.

The new machine would significantly reduce the mowing time and would be more suitable for pulling the roller around the field.

The club treasury has around \$6000.00 in it. This is due to the tractor fund which was established about 12 years ago. 15% of the dues money go into this fund, with the intent of having enough saved up to buy a new tractor when the old one wears out.
